• Homecoming 2020 Friday October 9: MHS is excited to announce plans for Homecoming 2020. This year Homecoming will be held on the evening of Friday, October 9, at Oaks Drive-in Movie theatre. There will be a live screening of the football game for Methacton students with Homecoming Court festivities held at halftime. Tickets will be \$20 per vehicle with a \$1.50 service fee. Drivers will register their cars and be able to purchase the tickets online. There is a maximum of 200 cars and they will be socially distanced in the facility. Vehicles will be turned away if...there are more people than seat belts in your vehicle, if you bring a pet, and if there are inappropriate decorations or items in or on your vehicle. Food will be available to be purchased through Oaks. Students are to remain in their vehicles unless they are using the restrooms, purchasing food, or taking a picture at their designated time (more information to follow). • **Student Assistance Program (SAP):** SAP is a process that helps students who are experiencing problems that interfere with learning, such as depression, emotional difficulties, peer conflict, alcohol, tobacco, and other drugs. Students are connected to existing services and/or community resources for help. Students can be referred by fellow students, staff, parents, community members, and self. When on premise instruction resumes, forms are also available outside of the School Counseling Office, the Nurses' Office, or the East Wing Main Office.

• Advanced Placement Exam Ordering: Students currently enrolled in Methacton Advanced Placement classes can begin to order their exams on September 21. Ordering will run through October 20. Exam fees are \$97 for all exams except AP Capstone Research, which is \$145. A <u>link</u> is available on the Methacton High School Homepage with directions for ordering exams online. College Board has waived the \$40 cancellation fee this year, so if a student changes their mind, they will not be financially penalized. More specific information will be shared with students as we get closer to the ordering date.
