School Board – Jennifer Cancro

The Shannondell tax appeal case has been settled, which leaves about \$7 Million dollars in an escrow account that now requires the Board to determine what to do with those funds. One recommendation is to move these funds to the Capital Reserve fund to fund small capital matters. This fund has been historically low making repairs that come up difficult to manage.

The budget will likely require a 2.2 % tax increase.

There will be an addition of 3 staff specifically targeted at supporting a 3-year plan to address math instruction K-12.

She just wanted to make that clear. She explained most things that the H&S are doing is being discussed at the building level with the principal so there's no need to involve the finance office.
